## Second Amendment Lesson

## **Follow Up Class Discussion Questions:**

- \*What makes the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment so hard to interpret?
- \*Have the student's views on gun control and/or the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment changed since the beginning of the lesson? Why?
- \*Can students "counter argue" the other side of the debate?
- \*How do the rulings affect or impact the student's life? What does the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment mean to you?
- \*What rules and regulations would you find acceptable or would you put in place if you were "in charge"?
- \*To what extent does the concept of a "well-regulated militia" apply to contemporary American society and more specifically national security?
- \*What can an individual citizen do to support this amendment's importance in American Democratic Society? Or work for more gun control?

## Student Big Ideas - or Take Aways:

- \*Define/Describe collective rights and individual rights. These concepts can come into conflict with each other.
- \*2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment original intention was collective rights and has evolved into individual rights.
- \*The function of the Supreme Court evolves/changes over time.
- \*Regulations vary from city to state to national (ie. Federalism)
- \*Use these specific cases and topic to see how the Supreme Court functions in general.
