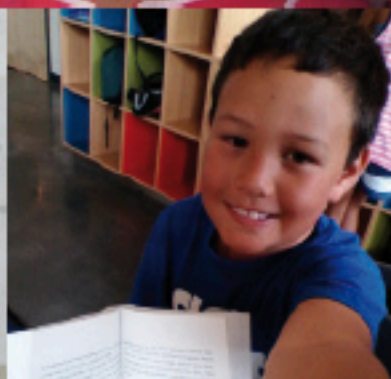

Because of your generosity, and 5,274 donors like you, we are pleased to share that for the eighth consecutive year, a multi-million grant distribution was recently awarded through Denver Post Charities, a McCormick Foundation Fund to nonprofit organizations across Metro Denver. You made a difference to the young boy struggling in reading and math, who improved his comprehension and increased his self-confidence.

More than \$1,550,000 was raised during the campaign. The McCormick Foundation matched every dollar raised by fifty cents, for an additional \$780,000. Recently, we held a reception for the 53 nonprofits receiving grants in 2015 and distributed a combined total of \$2,350,000 through Denver Post Charities.
