CHICAGO BULLS CHARITIES ANNOUNCES 2013 GRANT RECIPIENTS

The Chicago Bulls announced today that 12 Chicagoland nonprofit organizations will receive grants for the 2013-2014 season. The grants were awarded to organizations that support underserved Chicagoans and share the Bulls' commitment to youth education, health and wellness, and violence prevention.

Three grants were made by Chicago Bulls Charities and nine grants were made through the Chicago Bulls Community Assist Fund, a McCormick Foundation Fund. The Chicago Bulls Community Assist Fund, established in 2009, is supported with major funding from Chicago Bulls Charities, which is matched 50% by the Robert R. McCormick Foundation.

The nonprofit organizations receiving grants will be honored during an on-court ceremony at the Bulls game vs. Milwaukee Bucks on Tuesday, December 10. Chicago Bulls President and COO Michael Reinsdorf, Chicago Bulls Charities President Nancy Reinsdorf, Chicago Bulls Charities Vice President Leslie Forman and representatives from the McCormick Foundation will be in attendance to recognize these organizations.

These grants will support programs that have proven results and are making a significant impact on those in need."
