CANTIGNY GOLF RECEIVES HUMANITARIAN AWARD FROM REVELATION GOLF

Wheaton, III., June 24, 2014 — <u>Cantigny Golf</u>, in recognition for its work with disabled veterans, received the Humanitarian Award from <u>RevelationGolf</u> at the organization's 9th Annual Fundraiser, June 19, at Makray Memorial Golf Club in Barrington, III.

Cantigny, in partnership with RevelationGolf, conducts monthly clinics at the Cantigny Golf Academy for veterans with physical disabilities and those with PTSD. Some of the vets are just getting back to golf while others are new to the game. Many rely on modified and adaptive equipment. Some are even blind. But for all participants, RevelationGolf has shown that the game of golf can be a highly effective therapeutic and life-skills development tool.

"We strongly believe that golf is more than just a game, and that's one reason we're proud to support RevelationGolf," said Patrick Lynch, Cantigny head golf professional. "Working with the veterans who visit Cantigny is an honor and we are thankful to RevelationGolf for giving us the opportunity."

The Cantigny clinics, initiated in 2010, serve veterans from Edward Hines Jr. VA Hospital in Maywood and Jesse Brown VA Medical Center in Chicago.

The Humanitarian Award was presented by Donna Strum, RevelationGolf executive director.

"We are so grateful to Cantigny Golf for making our veterans feel welcome," Strum said. "We also appreciate how Cantigny and the McCormick Foundation went the extra mile to purchase a customized single-rider golf cart for our program participants."

In addition to veterans, RevelationGolf programs serve children and adults with cancer or a disability and at-risk girls ages 7 to 17.
