2015 Impact Report



Tornadoes devastate lives. They destroy homes and businesses. They take away one's sense of personal safety.

That's why the Robert R. McCormick Foundation teamed up with WGN Radio, *Chicago Tribune*, WGN-TV and *Hoy* to raise money to help our friends and neighbors in North Central Illinois. They have been struggling with the damage, destruction and grief from the record-breaking storms that hit Rochelle and Fairdale on April 9, 2015.

The Illinois Tornado Relief Effort 2015, a McCormick Foundation Campaign, supported nonprofit agencies providing disaster relief and recovery efforts to those communities hardest hit by the tornadoes. The McCormick Foundation matched the first \$500,000 raised at 50 percent for an additional \$250,000. All administrative costs were covered by the Foundation and its Partners. This allowed 100 percent of all funds raised, plus the match, to be granted directly to the nonprofit organizations highlighted in this report who helped those affected by the storms.

It is our hope that through these grants, these hard hit communities can rebuild their homes and their lives, becoming stronger through the process.

This report tells the story of the extraordinary work being done. We hope you find it as uplifting as we do. Remember – none of this would have been possible without your help.

Rebuilding Hopes and Homes





American Red Cross, Greater Chicago Region: \$350,000

After the storms, the American Red Cross sprang into action, dispatching more than 100 Red Cross trained volunteers to participate in the response effort. Dedicated volunteers prepared and distributed hot meals, hearty snacks, coffee and other relief items to residents, first responders and recovery crews. They built emergency aid stations with access to medication replacement, mental health services, food, relief items and casework and referral services. In an effort to leave no stone unturned, volunteers canvassed neighborhoods to meet clients at their own homes and distribute supplies. The Red Cross led efforts to open two multi-agency resource centers in Rochelle and Kirkland, convening more than 20 public, private and non-profit organizations to

provide services in a single location. As case management continues for affected families, the Red Cross is helping with direct financial assistance and developing household recovery plans. Since the night of the storms, 8,000 hot meals, 12,000 hearty snacks, 13,000 relief items and 430 clients have been served through comprehensive case-management.

Salvation Army, Heartland Division: \$150,000

When disaster strikes, the Salvation Army is there. Teams focused their emergency response to the hard hit Rochelle-Ashton-Hillcrest areas in DeKalb County. As a multi-agency resource center, the Salvation Army provided immediate and long-term care assistance, including meals, lodging, clean-up and reconstruction assistance and spiritual care to 100 tornado victims throughout the region.

Team Rubicon: \$12,000

Team Rubicon's mission is to unite the skills and experiences of military veterans with first responders to rapidly deploy emergency response teams. After the April tornadoes, the Team deployed 25 veteran volunteers to Fairdale, Illinois where they coordinated damage assessment, debris removal. roof and shelter repair, tree removal and water safety management. Knowing that detailed tracking of this data helps communities in proving the need for state and federal assistance, Team Rubicon tracked all work and gathered data on damage sustained and support provided by responding organizations.

Rochelle Area Community Foundation: \$150,000

Since 2005, the Rochelle Area Community Foundation has provided a simple way for community members to support local causes and organizations they care about most.

DeKalb County Community Foundation: \$388,659

By proactively addressing community needs and expanding, managing and distributing financial resources, the DeKalb County Community Foundation enhances the lives of families throughout the county.

Local foundations are key players in maintaining healthy communities by supporting the philanthropic programs that help their residents remain strong. The Rochelle Area Community Foundation and the DeKalb County Community Foundation will be providing long-term help for needs not met through traditional sources.

The Unmet Needs Roundtable is the ultimate safety net for those recovering from the devastation. When all other avenues have been explored and exhausted, the Roundtable provides critical funding to help those in the Rochelle area and DeKalb County with their individual recovery circumstances.
